

**IN RE:Israel D. Burgos, DEBTOR.
CASE NO. :00-32269-BKC-SHF**

Court found cause to reconsider and grant Claimant's Motion to Vacate Order Disallowing Claim and Voiding Lien. Service of the debtor's objection to claim upon the transferor of the claim, rather than on the transferee claimant and counsel for claimant as required by local and federal procedural rules was deficient and violated the due process safeguards embodied in Fed. R. Bank. P. 3007 and L.R. 3007-1. Even though debtor's counsel had not been served with the notice of transfer for the claim nor with counsel for claimant's notice of appearance, there was sufficient, albeit incomplete, information contained in the PACER docket entries to put debtor's counsel on inquiry notice that the claim had been transferred. Additional grounds to vacate the order existed because the order, which had been drafted by, and provided to the Court by debtor's counsel, granted more relief than sought in debtor's motion.
